

Napa-American Canyon Quake Information

On August 24, 2014, Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. issued an [emergency proclamation](#) extending relief to Napa, Solano, and Sonoma counties due to the effects of the earthquake in American Canyon and Napa Valley that caused injuries to citizens and extensive damage to homes, businesses, and infrastructure. The proclamation orders all State Agencies to work within the State Emergency Plan framework. The State Emergency Plan spells out that all levels of government must work together effectively, along with the private sector, business and industry, community based organizations and volunteers, to meet the challenges posed by a disaster.

The California ABC is already working with impacted licensees to provide assistance and find appropriate solutions to the damage resulting from the earthquake. The ABC Santa Rosa District (1-707-576-2165) and Oakland District (1-510-622-4970) Offices are available to answer questions from any ABC licensed businesses damaged in the earthquake.
