ABC Investigators Post Revocation Notice at San Francisco Store
San Francisco Police Investigation Leads to Revocation

San Francisco – ABC Investigators have posted a Notice of Revocation at the Nasser Market located at 511 Crescent St. in San Francisco. The action comes after a lengthy investigation dating back to March of 2009.

The license was revoked due to the sales of a controlled substance occurring at the premises, false ownership, and violations of the license conditions.

In August of 2009, a store employee (who was acting in the capacity of an owner that was not qualified by ABC) sold/facilitated the sale of illegal narcotics to an undercover officer on three separate occasions. Violations of the ABC license conditions were also noted.

SFPD officers went undercover multiple times to develop information that resulted in the arrest and also the subsequent revocation of the license.

Subsequent to the arrest, further investigation by ABC and SFPD revealed that the suspect had been acting in the capacity of an owner/licensee. Prior to obtaining an ABC license/ABC licensed business, all persons are required to notify the Department of their intent to sell alcoholic beverages. They are then thoroughly screened to meet eligibility requirements.

ABC is a department of the Business, Transportation and Housing Agency, which is under the direction of Secretary Dale E. Bonner, a member of the Governor's Cabinet.
