**Written statement explaining why the change does not materially alter any requirement, right, responsibility, condition, prescription or other regulatory element of any California Code of Regulations provision per Title 1, Section 100(b)(3):**

SB 1211 (Harman, Chapter 348, Statutes of 2008) amended Business and Professions Code Section 23399 to allow on-sale beer and wine licensees to serve and sell beer and wine at catered events away from their permanently licensed premises. Essentially, it allowed Type 41 (eating place) and 42 (public premises) on-sale beer and wine licensees to cater alcoholic beverages in the same manner as on-sale general licensees (Type 47/general eating place, Type 48/public premises, Type 57/special, Type 75/ brew pub and Type 78/wine, food and art cultural museum) were already allowed to do under the law at the time. And, as Type 51 Club and Type 52 Veterans Club licensees were allowed to do as well.

SB 1211 superseded Rules 60 and 60.5 and made them inconsistent with the statute. Specifically, Rules 60 and 60.5 do not specify that on-sale beer and wine licensees have authority to operate under caterer's permits.

These proposed amendments delete the list of authorized licensees as the list is duplicative of the statute, and add the reference citation.
